






#### **2018 House Election Results**




#### **2018 Senate Election Results**

#### **GOP Play Defense in 2020 Senate Map**

Republicans will try to protect 21 Senate seats in 2020, to the 12 that Democrats will defend. Only two of those 21 – in Maine and Colorado – had an electorate that chose Hillary Clinton over Donald Trump in 2016. Democrats will be defending two seats in "Trump States" – Alabama and Michigan.



#### **Governor Races**


#### Pre-election Party Control:

- 33 Republicans; 16 Democrats; 1 Independent
  - 26 states were held by Republicans
  - 9 states were held by Democrats
  - 1 state was held by an Independent
  - 18 gubernatorial races were for open seats


#### Post-election Party Control:

- 1 race undecided (GA)


#### **Governors 2018**




#### **Governors 2019**




# State Legislatures 2018




### **State Legislatures 2019**

# **State Attorney Generals**

#### Pre-election:

- 27 Republicans
- 22 Democrats
- 1 Independent

#### Post-election:

- 23 Republican
- 25 Democrats
- 1 Uncalled Race
- Maine will select a new Attorney General due to current AG Janet Mills (D) winning the Governor's Race

#### Review

- Most women ever in the Congress (122) for 2019
- Democrats win the popular vote
- Divided Federal Government means more action, fewer results
- > Watch for parallel agendas: Oversight and Legislative
- Senate 2020:
  - Republicans must defend 21; Democrats must defend 12
- State Governors: 26 Republican; 23 Democrat; 1 Undecided
- State Legislatures: 30 Rep; 18 Dem; 1 Split; 1 Nonpartisan
  - Trifecta: (House/Senate/Gov.): 21 Rep; 13 Dem; 13 Split
- State Attorney Generals: 23 Rep; 25 Dem; 1 Undecided; 1 TBD (Maine)

- > Senator Tim Scott (R) Serves on six (6) Committees, he may have one less Committee
- Incoming Congressman Joe Cunningham (D-1<sup>st</sup>) Seeking Transportation and Infrastructure Committee / Natural Resources Committee
- Congressman Joe Wilson (R-2<sup>nd</sup>) Seeking Ranking Member Position on Foreign Affairs Committee
- Congressman Jeff Duncan (R-3<sup>rd</sup>) Remains on Energy and Commerce Committee (unless, reduction on the Minority Side of the Committee eliminates his position)
- Incoming Congressman William Timmons (R-4th) Probably, Judiciary Committee
