Thanksgiving in the White House has been celebrated ever since President Abraham Lincoln declared in October 1863 that the last Thursday in November would be commemorated as Thanksgiving Day. Bipartisan Infrastructure Deal

The Bipartisan Infrastructure Deal passed Congress and has been sent to the President for signature. The bill is centered around rebuilding roads, bridges and rails, expanding clean drinking water, access to high-speed internet, climate crisis, environmental justice, and investing in communities that are normally left out. The White House has stated that the deal will help ease inflationary pressures and strengthen supply chains by making improvements at our ports, railroads, airports, and highways. It is estimated that the deal will add an average of 1.5 million jobs per year for the next decade. Here's a closer look at what this legislation will do:

- Deliver clean water to all American families and eliminate the nation's lead service lines.
- Ensure every American access to reliable high-speed internet.
- Repair and rebuild our roads and bridges with a focus on climate change mitigation, resilience, equity, and safety for all users.
- Improve transportation options for millions of Americans and reduce greenhouse emissions through the largest investment in public transit in U.S. history.
- Upgrade our nation's airports and ports to strengthen our supply chains and prevent disruptions that have caused inflation. This will improve U.S. competitiveness, create more and better jobs at these hubs, and reduce emissions.
- Make the largest investment in passenger rail since the creation of Amtrak.
- Build a national network of electric vehicle chargers.
- Upgrade our power infrastructure to deliver clean, reliable energy across the country and deploy cutting-edge energy technology to achieve a zero-emissions future.
- Make our infrastructure resilient against the impacts of climate change, cyber-attacks, and extreme weather events.
- Deliver the largest investment in tackling pollution in American history by cleaning up Superfund and brownfield sites, reclaiming abandoned mines, and capping orphaned oil and gas wells.

President Biden signed the Bipartisan Infrastructure Deal on Monday, November 15, 2021.

Next up on Congress's agenda, the rest of the \$1.75 trillion investment in the social safety net and climate policy. Senate Majority Leader Chuck Schumer said Democrats aim to pass the social spending bill by Thanksgiving. With no Republican support expected, Democrats can lose no more than three votes in the House. It would then go to the Senate to be passed under the special budget rules, but all 50 members of the Democratic caucus will have to support it for it to pass.
